

Signal-yellow curved façade makes waves at new Kent leisure centre

Expanded mesh panels align to profile of building to create curved façade

DESIGN

- Architects envisaged large yellow façade as the standout visual feature of new leisure centre
- Façade designed to align with the curved profile of building to create 'wave effect'
- Maple recommended expanded mesh panels, powder-coated in signal yellow, to bring architect's concept to life

MANUFACTURE

- Maple teams fine-tuned the design – liaised closely with metal supplier and steelworks contractor
- Expanded mesh rolled to create the precise profile required by architect's brief
- Samples supplied to approve panel design and powdercoating colour

INSTALLATION

- Specialist brackets used to achieve clean lines demanded by the brief
- Maple's experienced installation team rated 10/10 by main contractor for health and safety
- Installation of architectural façade completed ahead of schedule

VERDICT
